The University Veterans organization has a slate of 17 candidates for ten offices in its spring election with balloting scheduled for Wednesday evening, May 21 from 6 to 9 o'clock in the 'Y' room of the union, it was announced today by Harve Podoll, public relations chairman.

Successful candidates will be the new executive council and will take office at the beginning of the fall term with the present council serving thru the summer. No further nominations may be made but space is provided on the ballot for write-in candidates.

Student veterans who have a UniVet membership card for the spring term are eligible to vote any time from 6 to 9 o'clock next Wednesday evening.

Rehabilitation.

Veterans under Public Law 16 (The Vocational Rehabilitation Act) are required by the Veterans Administration to attend the summer school unless excused by the Veterans Administration. Public Law 16 veterans who do not receive prior approval from the Veterans Administration for non-attendance at Summer School will not be re-enrolled under the provisions of Public Law 16 for the fall semester of 1947-1948 until they have received such approval from the Veterans Administration.

Warning.

Any Public Law 16 veteran who wishes to absent himself from Summer School should report immediately to the training officer of the Veterans Administration at Bryan School, 19th and Q streets, (unless he has already done so) and ask for such permission.

The above does not apply to veterans under Public Law 346 (The G. I. Bill). Veterans under Public Law 346 may absent themselves from summer school, if they so desire.

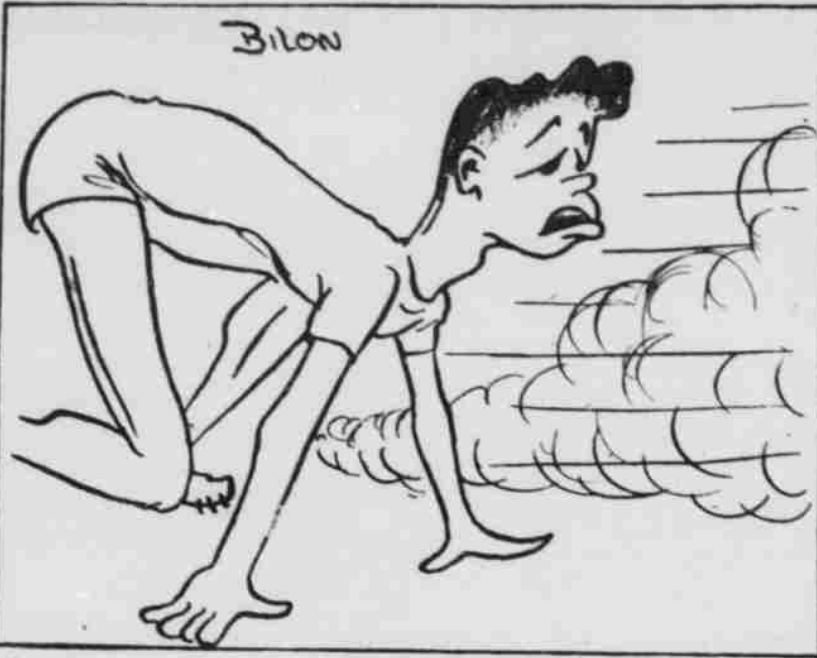
