# IM Notes

The 1947-48 intramural program, which has offered men students at the University of Nebraska one of their greatest years of competition, comes to a close within the next few days.

Louis E. Means, director of the intramural program, reported that during the last week alone on the campus 2,045 men participated in the organized competition in seven different activities. Some 850 women were also active in their intramural program during the same week.

The outdoor track carnival, one of the program's biggest events, drew 425 men participants. Almost all existing records were shattered in the meet.

Fifty-three teams with 792 men participating are in the final stretch of the softball campaign. Final playoffs have been scheduled and the champion will be decided next week. Phi Delta Theta, Sigma Alpha Epsilon, Beta Sigma Psi, Delta Upsilon, Theta Xi, Y.M.C.A., Field House, Hufnagle Field and Newman Club will collide in the playoffs for top honors.

Five of the 100 golf entrants remain in the running. They are Earl Auvinen, Roger Kasek, Garth Lof, Lee Chapin and Pete Hyland. The golf driving championship will be decided from the four surviving campus organizations this week.

Six tennis entrants will vie for singles honors while five doubles teams remain in the race.
