been in the association had taken advantage of their sex and that one of them had not paid dues owed to the association! The basis of admission of women to the debate squad which has existed since 1941 is based on the lack of a definite rule in the
university prohibiting women from participating in intercollegiate debate. Whether or not there is a woman's debate team this year will depend on how many interested and competent women
