Eight mat kings were crowned Monday night following the Nebraska-Purdue basketball game to climax the week-long intramural wrestling tournament.

Phi Gamma Delta, with three finalists, copped the grappling championship with 103 points. The Omaha All-Stars copped the runner-up honors with 88 points.
