

# 28 Gridders Get Awards

Head Grid Coach Bernie Masterson announced Friday that 28 members of the 1947 University of Nebraska football squad were awarded major letters.

Of the 28 men to receive the grid awards, 11 were first-time major letter winners. A player must see 75 minutes of action to earn a major award.

A look at the squad's iron-men shows that Tom Novak played a total of 452 minutes to top the list. Charles Toogood, playing his first varsity football, saw 429 minutes of action; Carl Samuelson played 421 minutes; Jack Pesek, 386; Fred Lorenz, 376; and Dale Adams, 337.

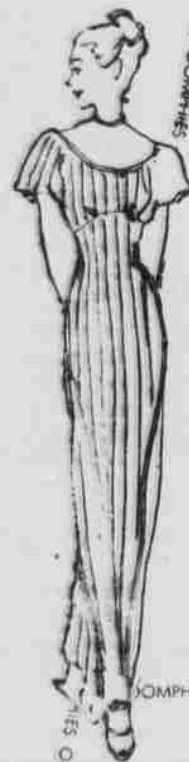
