

Nebraska Matmen Fall 20-6 to Colorado State

Nebraska's inexperienced mat squad split a pair of week-end wrestling matches with Colorado clubs as the Colorado State College grapplers defeated Coach Pat Patterson's charges 20-6 Saturday night. Friday Nebraska defeated Colorado University.

The Scarlet matmen got off to a successful start as Bob "Peewee" Yambor won a handy 9-4 decision over Aki Matsuoka in a 121-pound match to put Nebraska in a 3-0 lead.

But Kenny Brown, wrestling in the 128-pound class, fell victim to a half-nelson crouch pin hold in 2:15 to Ivan Gilbaugh and the visiting Colorado club went ahead, 5-3.

Jack Barrett hiked Nebraska hopes with a decision in the 136-pound group by defeating Joe Arnold 10-4. But that was the end of the Nebraska victories for the evening.

Close Verdict.

Jerry Calhoun, sturdy newcomer, lost a close 7-6 decision to Mel Spence. Spence gained the edge with a one-point top advantage. Jack Tamai also lost a one-point match as Lester Davison edged him 3-2.

Dick Hill, Andy Marinkovich and Rex Hoy all dropped decisions to Coach John Hancock's well-trained grapplers.

The Huskers will be host to the Iowa Teachers squad Tuesday night at 7:30. The match with the 1947 NCAA runnerup team will wind up the home activities for the Scarlet matmen.

NU Thinclads Tryout; Mark Tied by Hutton

The 1948 University of Nebraska track squad took its initial trial spin Saturday afternoon in preparation for its first dual meet with the University of Oklahoma in the stadium January 31.

Nine track events featured the initial Husker thin clad appearance with Dick Hutton's time in the 60 yard dash the highlight of the afternoon. Hutton tied the Big Six record held by Gene Littler, Nebraska, by racking up a fast .06.3. Close behind Hutton came Bill Moomey and Francis Fagot who were tied for second.

The only field event recorded was the shot put in which Dick Pederit's distance of 49.9½ feet proved to be the best effort of the day.

Coach Weir seemed to be pleased in some of the departments. Most of the runners seemed to be starting well in the dashes and Hutton's time seemed to indicate more to come in the future.

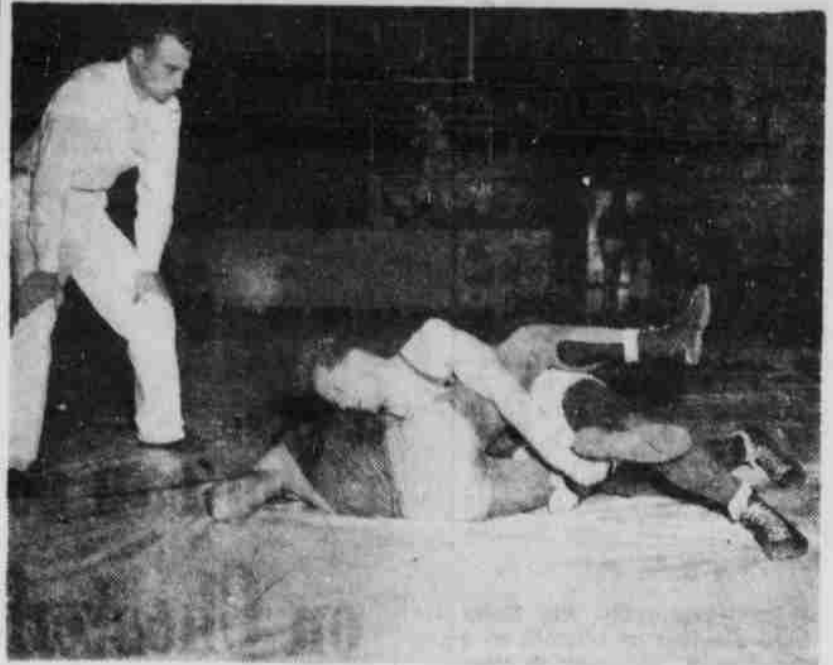

Gophers Sink Husker Swim Squad, 49-34

The Minnesota Gophers splashed to a 49-34 win over the Nebraska Cornhusker swimming team in a dual meet here Saturday.

Gaining six wins in nine events, the Gopher mermen handed Coach Hollie Lepley's squad its second straight setback of the weekend. The Huskers lost to Iowa State Friday night.

Marvin Grimm paced the losers with a first in the 100-yard freestyle and a second in the 50-yard freestyle. He also anchored the Huskers' winning 400-yard freestyle relay team.

CYCLONES WIN.

Nebraska's Marvin Grimm swam to a new 100-yard freestyle record and equalled the 60-yard freestyle mark, but the Scarlet mermen dropped a swim duel 61-23 to the Iowa State splashers Friday night at Ames. It was the first meet of the season for Coach Hollie Lepley's swimmers.

Two other meet records were broken—both by Iowa State relay teams. The Cyclones splashed the 300-yard medley relay in 3:05.2 and churned the 400-yard freestyle relay in 3:41.8.

Grimm chalked up a new 100-yard freestyle mark by swimming the distance in 54.2. His 29.7 time equalled the 60-yard freestyle record.
