

UN Athletes Face Action On Full Scale

Another big week-end of activity faces Nebraska university's athletes as Husker teams meet competition in five sports.

Coach B. R. Patterson's Scarlet grapplers open the week-end of sports when they travel to Ames to meet the Iowa State wrestlers Friday, Saturday night the Husker matmen will go against Minnesota university's squad in Minneapolis.

Cagers See Action.

Two Nebraska cage teams will see action Saturday night. Coach Harry Good's varsity quintet travel to Lawrence, Kas., to test the high-riding Kansas university Jayhawks. Phog Allen's crew is undefeated in loop play with a record of three straight victories.

Coach John Thompson's Nubbins carry Nebraska's colors in the other cage outing. The B team goes to Seward Saturday night to meet Concordia college. Thompson's boys have won two games and lost one to date.

Saturday is the big day for home athletic events. Coach Charlie Miller's gymnasts will entertain the University of Illinois in the coliseum at 2 p. m. Illinois defeated Nebraska in a contest earlier this season.

Two meets are scheduled for Saturday night. At 7:00 Coach Hattie Leply's swimmers will duel a strong Michigan State team in the Coliseum pool. Michigan State placed fourth in the N.C.A.A. swimming meet last year.

Coach Ed Weir will send his indoor track squad into action at 7:30 Saturday night against Iowa State's Cyclones. The Husker cindersmen will be after their second victory of the season. Oklahoma lost to Nebraska last Saturday, 62 1/2-41 1/2, on the Husker track. Iowa State's squad includes 11 letter winners and two cross-country letter winners.

Miller Bill Arlen will be one of the Cyclone's top performers. Arlen retired the Glenn Cunningham indoor mile trophy at the championships a year ago at Kansas City.

Rockets Rally To Top Links At Coliseum

Husker Swimming Squad Host To Michigan Staters Saturday

Nebraska's swimming team, fresh from a conference victory over Kansas University last Saturday afternoon, will step out of the Big Seven this week-end to entertain a powerful Michigan State team. Michigan State has one of the top swimming club in the country. The Spartans placed fourth in the N.C.A.A. Swimming Championships last year.

Top support for the Husker team is expected to come from Marvin Grimm. Grimm will swim in the 50-yard and 100-yard free style events and will anchor the 400-yard free style relay. Marv placed fourth and sixth, respectively, in these two individual events in the N.C.A.A. Swimming Championships last year.

Other pointgetters for Nebraska will be Conrad King in the 200-yard breaststroke event and Dick Bell in diving. Bill Fenton, top backstroke on the team, has been handicapped by a cold for three or four days and is not expected to be at top strength for the meet. Bill will swim his own event, the 150-yard backstroke, and will probably swim backstroke on the medley relay team.

Article 10th

The following Ratifications of the present Treaty, or provided in good form shall be exchanged between the contracting Parties in the Space of Six Months or sooner if possible to be computed from the Day of the Signature of the present Treaty. In Witness whereof we the undersigned plenipotentiaries have in their Names and on Virtue of our full Powers signed with our Hands the present Definitive Treaty, and caused the Seal of our Arms to be affixed thereto.

Done at Paris, the third Day of September, the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty seven.
