Green Tells Need Of Self-Education

Dean Roy Green, in his address to the American Institute of Chemical Engineers Wednesday emphasized the need for self-education and improvement after graduation to enable the engineer to advance in the face of increasing competition.

The supply of men in all fields of engineering will be inadequate to meet the requirements of U.S. industry until the graduation of the abnormally large class of 1950. Green said. Moreover, satisfying the demand may take even longer because of more opportunities for foreign service and the increasing use of engineers in non-technical positions.

Orman Mills, senior Chem E, spoke on "Psychology and Holding Your Job" and the evening was concluded with a discussion of plans for Engineer's Week.
