Tiger Ace Sets World Record; Huskers Take 3rd In Loop Meet

Madill Gartiser of Missouri set a new world's record of :06.8 seconds in the 60-yard low hurdles last night in Kansas City as the Tigers won the Big Seven indoor championship with a total of 671/4 points.

Kansas University upset the pre-meet predictions by taking second place with 35 points. Nebraska, an early favorite to push the Tigers, wound up in third place with 29%.

Six new Conference records were written into the books as the Tigers ran away with the meet, Gartiser set two marks, one in the lows and the other in the high hurdles. His time in the highs was :07.4. Hal Moore, Kansas, set a new record of 4:18.6 in the mile

A new shot put mark of 52 feet 4% inches was set by Rolliz Pra-thher of Kansas State, Another Kansan, Tom Scotield from Kansas University, leaped 6 feet 5% inches to better the high jump mark, And Missouri raced to a new record of 3:23.4 in the relay.
