WEATHER.

Continuation of yesterday's warm weather is expected for Lincoln today. The mercury should again approach the seventies with slightly increasing cloudiness.

Swollen rivers throughout the state and nation have begun to recede. Lack of heavy rains in most areas eased the annual flood problem.

THE NATIONAL BUDGET.

The house followed the senate Wednesday and decisively passed the GOP sponsored tax cut bill. With all 205 house Republicans and 84 Democrats supporting the bill, it has 52 more votes than are needed to over-ride a veto.

President Truman is expected to send a veto message next week. A reiteration of his pleas for maintaining high government income is probable.

Reports indicate some support for the President's veto may develop from the proposed increase in military expenditures.

STATES' RIGHTS.

The Tideland oil bill passed its first house test Wednesday. The bill, which duplicates a similar Senate measure, was approved by the house judiciary subcommittee.

Both bills will give states title to their tidelands.
