'Mystery Tune' Prizes Offered At Music Quiz

The Union music activities committee has a "Mystery Tune" stunt all its own! And with the prizes, too.

During its regular Thursday afternoon hour of recorded music in the Union music room at 4:15 p. m., the committee this week will stage a miniature music contest, offering to record albums as prizes for students who can name both title and composer of six selections.

Called "Musiquiz," the event is the first of its kind to be sponsored by the committee, and may recur at regular intervals if the response this Saturday is favorable, according to the committee chairman, Rex Pettijohn.

Asking the questions will be Sally Sipple, committee member. Questions on both popular and serious music will be asked, and prizes awarded accordingly. An album of "Jazz at the Philharmonic," featuring the group sponsored at the coliseum by the Union last fall, will be given as the popular-music prize. Khatchaturian's "Gayne Ballet Suite," which has achieved popularity chiefly for its "Sabre Dance," will be the prize in the serious music field.

During the adding-up of scores, a special recorded program will be played.
