

Missouri Frosh Defeat Huskers in Postal Meet

University of Missouri defeated Nebraska 70½ to 51½ in a postal freshmen outdoor track and field meet.

Mountford Tops Huskers. Bill Mountford of Red Cloud was the Huskers' outstanding scorer with 11 points. He won the 880-yard run in 1:58, took second in the mile run and 440-yard dash.

Fritz Davis of Lincoln won the discus with a toss of 140 feet-4 inches and the shotput with a 45 foot-7 inch effort.

Burney Wins Two. The Huskers' other double winner was Darrell Burney of DeWitt, winning the high jump (6-1) and broad jump (21-11).

Missouri's Vanet scored a triple win and ran on the Tigers' winning relay team. He copped the 100-, 200- and 440-yard dashes.

Huskers Host To Big Seven Track Carnival

Nebraska University plays host to the Big Seven track and field championships Friday and Saturday in Memorial Stadium.

Hopes for a Nebraska triumph appear slim. Coach Tom Botts' Missouri Tigers, winners of the indoor title, will field a balanced squad of hurdlers and dashmen, with sure points in the field events, rule as favorites in the two-day carnival.

Harry Meginnis, Dick Hutton and Al Thompson will carry Nebraska's hopes in the short dashes. Meginnis also is the defending broad jump king, Loyal Hurlbert and Jim Martin, indoor rulers in the 440 and 880 respectively, are counted on to swell the Scarlet point total in those events. Husker Vaulter Don Cooper, who is defending his crown in that event, should be ready to take first place points.

Coach Weir's weight men may surprise in the field events. Wayne Sees' performance in the Colorado dual meet, coupled with Dick Piderit's consistent efforts in the shot, could give the host team some needed points.

Patton Cracks World Century Mark in 9.3

Mel Patton, the United States' main sprint hope in the Olympics, bettered the world's 100-yard dash record Saturday when he was timed in 9.3 seconds.

The University of Southern California ace is co-holder of the official mark of 9.4 seconds.

Patton sped to the history-making time in the 22nd annual West Coast Relays at Fresno, Calif. Lloyd La Beach, Negro star, finished only inches behind Patton. La Beach will represent Panama in the Olympic games this summer.

Three of the five timers clocked Patton at 9.3 seconds, while the other two showed 9.4. The time was made under ideal running conditions.

Dillard Wins 67th Victory; Sets Record

Harrison Dillard, great Negro sprinter and hurdler for Baldwin Wallace College, set a new world record for consecutive wins in collegiate competition Saturday when he ran his victory chain to 67.

The old mark of 65 was set by Greg Rice, Notre Dame middle and distance runner, between 1941 and June 29, 1943.

Dillard smashed three stadium marks in his college's dual meet with Miami University. He won the century in 9.8, the high hurdles in 14.4 and the 220-yard lows in 23.9.
