Sooners Golf Champs; Jays Win Tennis

Oklahoma set a new course record Saturday in the Big Seven golf championships as the Sooners won the title with a total of 584 points. Charlie Coe, ace Sooner golfer, broke the existing record for the Lincoln Country Club course as he toured the fairways in a blistering 64. He combined a 72 Friday with this mark to win medalist honors with a 36-hole total of 136.

The Husker golfers came in a close second with an aggregate of 597 points, followed by Colorado with 603, Iowa State with 619, Kansas with 625, Missouri with 627, Kansas State with 654. Del Ryder of Nebraska was medalist Friday with a 71 total along with Wayne Speegle of Oklahoma.

Kansas Wins. Kansas University came from behind in the Big Seven tennis championships Saturday to edge Oklahoma and cop the tennis title. Kansas gathered a total of 14 points, followed by Oklahoma with 12, Colorado and Missouri with 7, Iowa State with 6, Kansas State with 2, and Nebraska with 1.

Kansas took two single wins in the finals and three doubles victories to gather their winning points.
