

Students Receive Services At Student Health Clinic

Just as during the regular school year, students at the University are entitled to services and facilities of the Student Health from the time regular classes begin, provided the student has completed his registration.

This services ends at midnight on the last day of final examinations at the close of each semester or summer school session.

Hours for the city campus clinic are from 8-12 a.m. and 1-5 p.m. Monday thru Friday and from 8-12 Saturday morning. The clinic is closed Saturday afternoons, Sundays and vacations. Student infirmary visiting hours are from 2:30 to 4 p.m. and 7 to 8:30 p.m.

No medical or hospital services are furnished during vacations, except in the case of a student who is hospitalized at the time a vacation begins, and then in the case of emergency only.

Services.

The student health service fee entitles the student: To a complete physical examination on entrance (required of all students entering the university for the first time), one complete physical examination every year thereafter while enrolled in the university, military and physical education placements, intra-mural and swimming examinations; special examinations required by Nebraska statutes for certification of teacher; and to all medical services which can be rendered to ambulatory patients.

Consultations with specialists are available as to diagnosis only on ear, eye, nose, throat, orthopedic, neurological and psychiatric problems upon authorization of one of the staff doctors.

A clinical laboratory service is maintained by the student health service which entitles a student to ordinary clinical laboratory tests and services, X-ray photographs, electrocardiographs, and basal metabolism tests, for the cost of materials used and upon authorization of staff doctor.

Drug Room.

A drug room is maintained in the pharmacy building where prescriptions are compounded and medical supplies can be purchased.

The cost for hospitalization will be carried by the health service except for the \$1 per day charged to the student.

Students may not use the coliseum swimming pool without a swimming permit issued by the student health. Also, each student must obtain a special permit before engaging in any intramural sport.

The student health department for the past year has been undergoing a complete re-organization to increase facilities.

New Facilities.

The new facilities at present consist of a two-story temporary structure (formerly a naval F.O.Q.) located at the southeast corner of the quadrangle. The first story is the dispensary and the second story the infirmary, consisting of 15 bedrooms with a maximum capacity of 26 beds. It is hoped that, in the next several years, this temporary structure will be replaced by a permanent and adequate student health center building.

Colbert Explains Authorization Notice of Subsistence Pay

Student-veterans who were in school the second semester ended on June 5, and who are continuing in summer school, will receive a notice of authorization of subsistence allowance from the veterans administration (V. A. form 7-506), stating that payments for the summer session will start June 21, 1948.

This requires an explanation, according to J. P. Colbert, director of veterans consultation board.

Pay Continued

The veterans administration is continuing the second semester subsistence of such students on to June 20, 1948, which is 15 days (vacation allowance) beyond June 5. Summer subsistence will then start on June 21 and continue on for 15 days beyond the close of the summer session.

Veterans who were not in

school the second semester just ended, but who are registered for summer school, will receive subsistence from the beginning of summer school. Thus all veterans will receive subsistence for summer school plus 15 days of vacation allowance. The 15 days of vacation allowance will be deducted from each veteran's time entitlement.

Vet to Report

Any veteran who does not wish to have 15 days deducted from his time entitlement, should report to the office of the veterans consultation board, 101 mechanic arts hall, on or before the dates listed below:

For those attending short summer session—June 15, 1948. For those attending long summer session—June 30, 1948. In such case no vacation allowance will be paid.
