

Law College Dean Beutel Revises Negotiable Instruments Law Book

Dean Frederick K. Beutel, of the Nebraska Law College, has recently prepared the seventh edition of Brannan's Negotiable Instruments Law. The last two editions were also revised by Dean Beutel.

The comments by the author have been greatly enlarged, revised and brought to date. Leading cases from the mass of decisions have been carefully selected. Those which merely cite the sections generally or fail to add anything to the contents, have been eliminated; but all authorities covering subsidiary questions of law under the Act have been set out in full.

The material is arranged as nearly as possible to conform with the subject matter of the Act, and for this reason is placed under the subsections of the Act, wherever possible. Side heads are inserted to further classify the material and to facilitate reference to the subject matter.

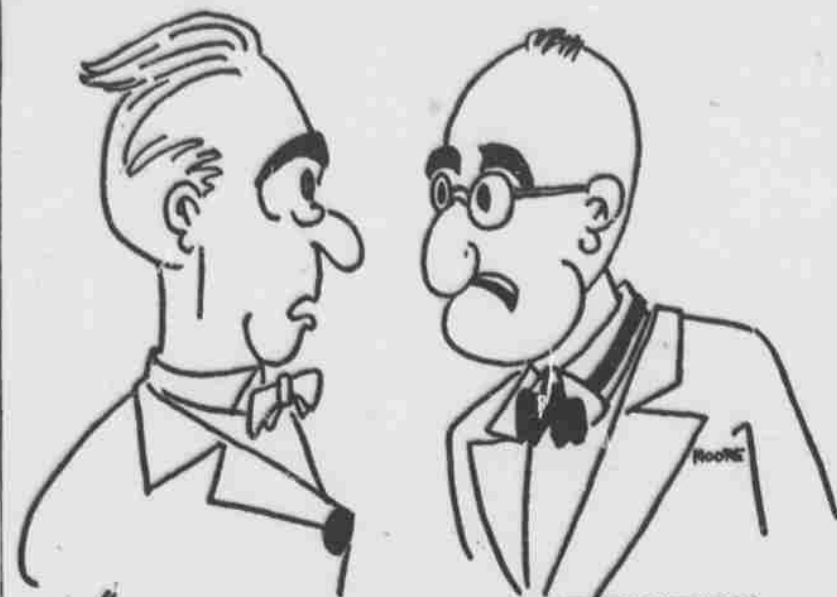

instantly at hand the complete text and decisions on the law of any desired phase of the subject. This makes possible a complete grasp of the meaning of the Act, as applied to any point, and is a useful aid in interpreting the law.

References to articles in all law reviews are given so as to furnish access to a more extensive discussion of the authorities. The work also includes citations to A.I.R. and the Reporter system, and a mass of easily accessible source material, all necessary in the writing of briefs and learned articles.

Another feature of this edition

is the inclusion of the complete English Bills of Exchange Act. There are many references to the B.E.A. in the commissioner's notes, and a comparison of the two acts should reveal much of the legislative history of the N.I.L.

Part one of the work also contains the Act, with statutory variations, and cross-references to related sections. This makes its highly technical material more "available" to the user and will be a distinct aid where an independent systematic interpretation of the Act is desired. Tables in part three enable a lawyer in any state to easily locate his own statutes.

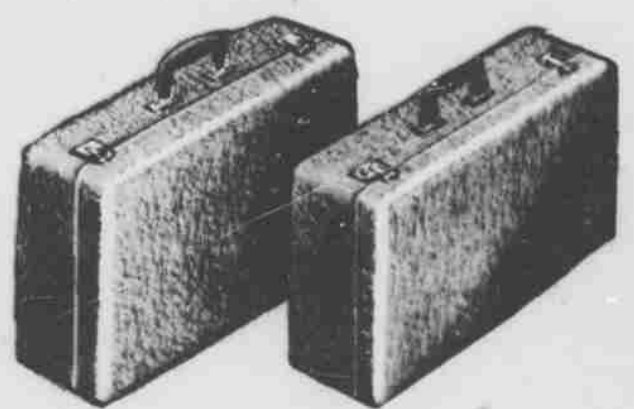
