

Strong Competition Expected In City Swim Meet Aug. 3

Lincoln people will witness one of the most highly contested swim meets in city swim meet history when aqua artists from Lincoln gather at Capitol Beach Tuesday, Aug. 3 to settle city swim honors.

This year's festival has been broken up to insure a more speedy run-off and offer more competition for the swimmers. The city junior championships will be run off at the municipal pool Friday, July 30 at 7 p. m. The senior title will be settled at Capitol Beach the following Tuesday.

Local Talent.

A gathering of local talent will be set to make it tough for last year's winners with keen competition seen in the men's senior division. Don Devries, home from Shattuck Prep school will

be gunning along with Jim Woodworth to capture the coveted Lambert Memorial Trophy in the 200 yard free style from sprinter Marvin Grimm.

Grimm, UN sprint specialist, captured city swim honors last year swimming the 50 and 100 yard freestyle and coming thru for the Lambert Trophy. Jack Campbell, Husker backstroker, trailed Grimm by must two points to take runner-up honors.
