Y Forum Deals With Religion In Education

A forum discussion on "The Place of Religion in State Education" will be held in the Temple building Wednesday evening at 7:30 o'clock. This forum is sponsored by the university YMCA.

The Rev. Virgil Anderson of the Warren Methodist church and the Rev. Philip Schug of the All Souls Unitarian church will be the main speakers.

The discussion will be based on the Supreme Court case of McCollum vs. the State of Illinois. The subject of the case was the teaching of religion during school hours. A Mrs. McCollum had protested that it was not right for her son to learn religion in the public schools. First taken to state courts, the case was finally carried to the Supreme Court. The decision, in favor of Mrs. McCollum, declared that it was unlawful to teach religion of any sort during school.

Reverend Schug will uphold the court decision. He was Mrs. McCollum's advisor during the trial.

A cabinet meeting at 6:30 p. m. will precede the forum.
