Vets Leaving School to Receive VA Check After Semester End

Veterans now in school who do not register for second semester will automatically receive leave subsistence for 15 days after the close of the first semester. This is in accordance with the regulation of the Veterans Administration and applies only to those veterans under P. L. 346 (the G. I. Bill).

Each veteran who receives this leave subsistence will have 15 days deducted from his remaining time entitlement. If his time entitlement has expired the leave subsistence will not be paid.

Conserve Entitlement

Any veteran who wishes to conserve his time entitlement and who does not wish to have 15 days deducted from it, should notify the Veterans Administration, 12th and O Streets, Lincoln, J. P. Colbert, director of the Veterans Consultation board has announced. Letters must be postmarked on or before

December 30 in order to guarantee their acceptance.

Veterans in school or training under the GI bill who want to change courses of study or transfer to other institutions today were reminded that they might obtain permission from the Veterans Administration at least 30 days in advance of the intended move or risk being dropped from the program temporarily, with subsequent loss of subsistence payments.

A veteran wishing to change his course of study must get permission from VA before making the move or be dropped from subsistence rolls under the law which prohibits such payments to veterans pursuing courses not approved by the agency.

To make certain their GI life insurance will provide the exact protection desired, Nebraska vet-

erans are urged by the Veterans Administration to review their government insurance for possible changes of beneficiaries and methods of settlement. Ashley Westmoreland, Lincoln regional office manager, also advised those carrying GI policies to study the various optional methods of settlement available for payment of insurance proceeds to beneficiaries. In some cases, he said, proper selection of optional settlement may increase benefits as much as 30 percent.
