By Jerry Ewing. Oklahoma A & M, NCAA champions, took a 23 to 5 victory over a green Nebraska mat team Friday night. This was the sixty-second consecutive dual victory for Aggie wrestlers.

Herb Reese was the Husker hero as he threw Rod Boker in the 175 pound class. This was the lone Nebraska victory and saved a white washing at the hands of

the Oklahomans. The Aggies started with Bill Jernigans victory in the 121 pound division, and captured the first six matches. Then came Reese's triumph. Herb led 5-2 on points after two periods, before

pinning Baker in 6:21.

In the evening's closest match Dick Hutton, a member of last summer's US Olympic team, took a narrow decision from Mike Diblase, 3-0. The heavier Hutton, who outweighed Mike by 40 pounds, gained a one point advantage in the second period by scoring on an "escape." Dibiase failed to break Hutton's advantage in the third period, giving the huge Oklahoman two points for time advantage.

Only one fall was carded by the Aggies, that coming in the 165 pound division when Jack St. Clair threw Al Johnson in :49.

The well-coached Aggies showed their greatest adeptness in their ability to break advantages In no period could the NU grapplers hold advantage.

Indoor golf' practice is available for men students and faculty men on the golf driving range in the Coliseum basement each day according to Louis E. Means, physical education di-


Students and faculty men may use the indoor golf range at any-time between 8:30 a, m. to 5:30 p. m. daily, and on Saturday morning until noon.
