One of the films, entitled "Le Chantier sur les Ruines," depicts devastated France after the second World War. A few scenes of the countryside after World War I are also shown, including pictures of the city of Reims.

Scenes Include Dunkerque

Warld War II scenes include Beauvais, the landing at Dunkerque and pictures of battered ships of war. The ruined buildings and cathedral of St. Lo are shown, and the buildings of Caen are shown as mere rubble. Graphs indicate the percentage of delost in the war and those that were taken prisoner.
