

# Mid-year Degrees Conferred Saturday

The University of Nebraska conferred degrees on a record-breaking class of 531 persons Saturday morning.

The 1949 mid-year group compares with the previous record of 357 last year, 231 in 1947, and the pre-war average of about 150. 40 1/2 percent of the class were among the 531 to graduate.

Totals of graduates, by colleges or divisions, were: Junior Division, 9; Agriculture 76, Arts and Sciences 83, Business Administration 132, Engineering 98, Law 3, Pharmacy 23, Teachers 52, Medicine (Nursing) 4, and Graduate College 52.
