

## Law Students Stage Assault An Battery in Demonstration

Flying fists and coke bottles on the second floor of the law building have provided Law students with a practical example of assault and battery.

Heated words exchanged in the Law Association room led to the exchange of coke bottles. Students Sam Zimmerman and Richard Gruver carried the scrap into the hall where they exchanged

punches before more than 50 fellow students.

**GRUVER HAS FILED** charges with the clerk of the district court of Allen through his attorneys, Dick Hunter and Bob McNutt. Gruver is charging Zimmerman with assault and battery and is asking for \$500 damages. His attorneys stated that he was brutally beaten.

Zimmerman is being represented by the firm of Binning and Myers who expressed complete confidence that their client's innocence can be proven when the district court convenes.

**RELIABLE** information was impossible to obtain due to the conflicting testimony by witnesses. It is certain, however, that a heated personal argument touched off the affair.

## Christianity's Biggest Enemy Is Communism, Says Minister

"Christianity's most formidable enemy today is Communism."

This pointed statement was made last night by Dr. Robert J. McCracken as he spoke for the second night at the annual Ministers' convocation at St. Paul Methodist church.

Using as his theme "Communism's Effect on Religion," Dr. McCracken asserted that Communism is constantly attempting to arouse dissension and disunity in Christian religion. He expressed the dire need to weaken the Reds' grip on half of the world by combating its influence on religion.

"Communism expects Christianity to usher in those things which it professes," explained McCracken. He pointed to the Soviets' moves to gain support by tying in Communist ideals with Christian beliefs.

"Yet," he declared, "Communist ethics are at complete log-

gerheads with Christian ethics."

Due to the fact that the Comies have "no affixed moral principles," the party member "must be able to override human consideration for the sake of the party," said the pastor of New York's Riverside church. He added that a Soviet citizen is treated not as a human made in God's likeness, but as "so much state material."

Meaning "not to be uncharitable," McCracken warned that "organized Christianity is not without its own shortcomings." He said Christianity is failing to emphasize that building up military might is not the only way of combatting Communism. He also reminded that both World Wars had strengthened Communism tremendously.

He proposed that we should keep on maintaining a conciliatory attitude toward the Reds that should be free of domineering

and arrogance. We should establish a "missionary attitude," and should attempt to defeat the Communist purpose with all of our religious influence," in eastern Europe, Asia and in Moscow, itself."

"The Communist," he said, "is sent to the factory, business places, and schools to win over those with whom he associates. Are we," he asked, "actively propagating the Christian faith?"
