

Regimental Parade to Climax Federal ROTC Inspection Tour

A two-day federal inspection tour of the university Army and Air Force ROTC units will be climaxed with a regimental parade Tuesday at 1 p. m. west of the coliseum. The public is invited to witness this event.

Five officers representing the field and air forces of the Department of Defense are making the inspection, which covers all activities of ROTC on the campus.

SIX AWARDS will be presented.

The Pershing award, for the top military student in the Pershing Rifles established in the will of the late General John J. Pershing, to be presented by Miss Mae Pershing, Lincoln, the General's sister; the Nebraska 40 and 8 award; the American Legion Auxiliary award; the Honor Company award; the Air Force Association award; and the Certificate of Proficiency to the ROTC unit on the basis of last year's inspection.
