

# NU To Hold Auto Driving Conference

Experts who will have charge of the University's workshop conference for teachers' training in driver education include Marland K. Strasser, Lt. O. H. Witt and Dr. Galen P. Saylor. This conference will be held in Teachers college May 23-27.

Forty teachers and administrators can be accommodated in the class and enrollments will be accepted as they come. There will be no enrollment fee. The course features classes for teachers and administrators who wish to qualify as instructors in driver education and traffic safety in Nebraska high schools next fall.

Strasser, one of three officials in charge, is assistant educational director of the public safety division of the Association of Casualty and Surety companies in New York. He is doing this sort of work throughout the country.

Driver education is growing in Nebraska high school and more than 100 schools are offering it during the current semester. Those who successfully complete the work of the conference will be certified to teach the subject in Nebraska high schools. The conference will be the only one held in Lincoln this summer.
