Good Moves Bob Cerv to First String

Coach Harry Good, in an effort to develop a team scoring machine, has moved Bob Cerv into the starting lineup for the season's basketball opener with South Dakota State Saturday.

Beginning basketball practice with a trick knee, Bob has been improving every practice and should be a good prospect for All-Conference honors when the season ends. Last year Bob was the third highest scorer on the Husker quintet with 181 points for an average of 6.9 points per game.

Rounding out the first five are Bus Whitehead, Joe Malecek, Tony Lawry, and Bob Gates.

Whitehead, second only to Claude Retherford in scoring for the 1948 Cornhuskers and All-Big Seven Conference center, will be playing his final year at center for the Huskers.

At forwards for the Huskers are Malecek and Lawry, both rugged defensive players who should see plenty of action under the boards for the Cornhuskers. Together they scored 269 points which helped gain Nebraska a tie in the Big Seven championship race.

Filling out the quintet at the other guard is Gates, a former All-State cager at Omaha Holy Name. Although failing to win a letter last year Gates displayed his ability as a set shot artist and ball handler.

Nebraska Host to Swim Jamboree

A swimming jamboree for boys of all ages will be held Saturday, Dec. 10, at the University of Nebraska pool.

Hollie Lepley, Cornhusker varsity swimming coach, has issued invitations pointing out that the jamboree provides an opportunity to compare condition, form and time in friendly competition.
