

Fraternities Urged to Erase Racial Bars

Reversing its previous stand, the national interfraternity conference last week at a meeting in Washington, D. C., adopted a resolution urging college fraternities to erase from their charters any racial or religious bars to membership.

An undergraduate movement which started in New England caused the conference turnout. The northeastern schools were joined by some of the midwestern universities and colleges during the three-day meeting there.
