that any registrant who is a full-time student (12 semester hours or more) doing satisfac-tory work SHALL be deferred IF he makes a request for deferment to his local board. Such deferments are called "statutory deferments" and are good only until the end of the academic year in which they are given.

In order to give the bocal draft boards some basis for deciding which students should be deferred beyond the automatic statutory period, the Selective Service System has set up the college qualification test pro-gram. The qualification tests, given from time to time, are open to all student registrants but the test may be taken only once.






