Buff-Cyclone Dual Saturday

Colorado and Iowa State got together Saturday for their second dual track meet of all time...

Thirteen of the fifteen dual marks set in their first meeting last spring at Ames are up for chopping block consideration...

All others have been bettered or equalled in previous competition this spring.

Along with the record-breaking Colorado Coach Frank Potts forecasts the closest competition for his performers this year.

This year, Burl Berry's outfit edged the Buffs for second place in a triangular at Manhattan, Kansas, scoring 36 1/2 points to Colorado's 34.

That has been one of the woes for Potts who watched his Buffs fall below the Cyclones after managing a third place finish in the Big Seven indoor, best for a Colorado team.

"We've got to get over that inconsistency if we are to do anything outdoors," Potts warns.

For example, points Potts had counted on in a dual at Nebraska Monday went to the Huskers and forced the buffies into their worst showing this season.

Buff bright spots were the shot where Big Seven champ Wally Tanner got off his best heave to date, 62-2 1/2; the low hurdles where soph Pat Hindman set a new dual mark of 24.3; and the two mile where Bill Gavito ran

Baseballers Sweep Series From Aggies

The University of Nebraska baseball team became one of the nation's top baseball teams in a doubleheader last weekend by conquering Oklahoma A. & M., 12-3 and 12-10.

In the first game, the Huskers gained revenge for the 8-5 licking they received at the hands of the Cowpokes at Stillwater, Okla., where they met for the first time in early April. The second game merely added insult to injury.

Jerry Dunn and Bill Giles were the "guns" for the Husker diamond crew in the first game. They both banged out circuit clouts.

Franny Hofmaier went all the way for the Cornhuskers in picking up his second victory of the season. He was the victim of the Aggies uprising that cost Nebraska seven runs and the game in the last game between the two teams.

Hofmaier allowed only seven hits, one of which was a home run by second baseman Jerry Webster.

Only Murry Backhaus and Bob Diers were unable to get into the hit column as they went 0-5 and 0-3, respectively. Bobby Decker, Bobby Reynolds, Giles and Hofmaier provided the nucleus of the 11 Nebraska hits.

It was the first loss of the season for Marlon Moss of the Cowpokes. He had won four straight games previous to the Husker game.

In the second game of the series, the caliber of play drooped considerably as the Cowpokes were charged with three errors and Nebraska seven.

Ray Novak came in to Charlie Wright in the fourth inning and went on to win his fourth straight game of the year for Coach Tony Sharpe.

Jerry Dunn and Bobby Reynolds teamed up to bat in seven

of the Huskers' 11 runs. Nebraska scored two runs in the first frame when Reynolds singled, a wild pitch and an error.

They picked up two more runs in the next inning when Decker singled with a man on and Reynolds hit a double to score both runners.

The big push for the Cornhuskers came in the fourth inning when they pushed across six runs. It was at this critical point in the game that Dunn put the ball over the left field fence for a homer.

The score was knotted at 10-10 going into the sixth when the Huskers scored their winning runs of the game.

The fans got somewhat of a treat when Freddy Babb, A.M. centerfielder, was given the heave-ho from the ball park for the misuse of the good English language. Umpire John Hergert did the honors.

The Nebraska team has now worked themselves to an 11-3 record for the season and they will be out to pad that victory column by two games when they meet the Iowa State Cyclones at Ames, Ia., Friday and Saturday.

Don Bedker Makes Last Home Appearance Again Kansas State Tomorrow

Don Bedker, University of Nebraska hurdler, will make his last appearance before the home folk Tuesday when the Cornhuskers go against Kansas State in a dual meet here.

The field events start at 2:10, the running at 3:40.

Bedker, who slammed both hurdle races in the 1952 Big Seven Indoor Championships, is gaining for a repeat in the Conference outdoor meet which will be held May 16 and 17 at Norman, Okla.

Don, like Kansas State's Thane Baker, was just another competitor during his high school days at North Platte. His best time was :15.2.

However, a pulled muscle in the third meet of his senior year shelved Bedker for the remainder of his prep school career.

Bedker did not letter as a sophomore at Nebraska, but he was competing against some of the top Husker timber toppers in Wendell Cole, Ray Magsamen and Bob Berkshire.

However, the long legged lad from North Platte began to come to the fore as a junior. He was second in the Conference indoor meet and third in the outdoor tests in 1951.

In a dual meet against Colorado here, April 28th, Bedker hit his peak performance.

He won the high hurdles in :14.4, best time of any Nebraska hurdler through the years, but Coach Ed Weir ruled the favoring 6 mph wind was too much help to let it stand as a varsity mark.

The performance did go into the books as a meet record. Bedker, according to Coach Weir, is entitled to a double salute. Lacking natural speed, Bedker has had to make up for this with perfect hurdling form plus a fast start. And he is a good starter, rarely being left at the post.

Coach Weir believes that additional weight has helped the North Platte lad. Bedker put on about eight pounds last summer which seemed to provide the strength he needed to carry through a full flight of hurdles at his top speed.

Don now weighs 165 and is 6 feet tall.
