Duffek Lost: Eighty-Two Report For Frosh Drills

"We want these freshman football players to feel that it's something to be a member of this team," said Freshman Coach Ed Nyden as the yearlings start their practice sessions.

Of the 82 reporting for fall workouts are Nebraska All-Staters Roger Krhounek, Lincoln; Claire

Boroff, Grand Island; Mal Dohrman, Kearney; Mike Lee, Grand Island; Dick McCashland, Geneva; and Dick Wood, Lincoln. Krhounek, Boroff, Dohrman, and McCashland are backs while Lee doubles as a fullback and end and Wood is a tackle. Another Nebraskan, Jack Duffek, tackle from Lincoln was forced to give up the gridiron sport because he failed the physical examination. From Mt. Morris, Michigan come the Batson twins, John and Bob, who play tackle. Ed Corazzi, a quarterback from Fredericktown, Pa.; Bennie Dillard, a Mt. Pleasant, Texas halfback; and Roy Stinnett, a quarterback from Ripley, Tennessee, are a few of the out-of-state players who chose Nebraska as the institution where they would receive their college education.

Big 7 Faces Tough Foes

With the Big Seven Conference teams encountering non-loop foes this weekend, Nebraska's Cornhuskers seem to face the roughest of the lot. The Huskers, however, may not be alone in facing an uphill battle.

Nebraska makes the long journey to Columbus, Ohio, to meet the highly touted Buckeyes of Ohio State, returning Rose Bowl champions. With four candidates for All-American honors including All-Everything Howard "Hopalong" Cassidy, Ohio State is going to be pressing for top honors in the Big Ten, along with the National crown.

Coach Bud Wilkinson's answer to Big Seven contention on the national scene will be unveiled against North Carolina. Wilkinson stated earlier this year he was rebuilding, a task which shouldn't be too hard with 14 lettermen. The Sooners have nailed down 19 wins in a row and don't seem to be about to lose this inaugural to the Tarheels.

Missouri continues to follow the pattern set by the other Big Seven schools; that of a difficult schedule this year. The Tigers tangle with another Big Ten power in the form of Michigan.

The freshmen have a two-game schedule starting Oct. 28 when the yearlings from Iowa State journey to Memorial Stadium. One week later the frosh go to Manhattan, Kansas to engage the freshmen from Kansas State College.

"Although we only have two games, we intend to make this team a working unit and we intend to have the boys proud of this outfit," said Nyden who is in his first year as freshman coach. The mentor was a letterman on the 1946-47 editions of the Nebraska gridiron crew. He comes from five successful years as a high school and junior college coach in the football-crazy Southern California area.

Down, but not out, the Nebraska Cornhuskers are hoping to pick themselves up off the floor as they journey to Columbus, Ohio, to meet the powerful Ohio State Buckeyes. The Huskers opened their 1955 campaign with an upset loss to Hawaii, 6-0.



The Buckeyes, last year's Big 10 kingpins and winner over USC in the Rose Bowl 21-7, will boast a powerful backfield, led by All-American Howard Cassidy. The speedy senior halfback will be joined by Elwood at quarterback, Harknradler at the other halfback, and Vicic at fullback. Vicic is replacing the hard-driving Hubert Bobo at the fullback slot.

For NU, a possibility of a few changes will be in order. Jerry Wheeler, sophomore tackle may draw a starting berth in place of sophomore Don Rhoda and Harry Johnson, junior from Valley, may go in place of Willie Greenlaw.

Bill Taylor, senior guard, will captain the Nebraskans. Bill Hawkins is slated to see more action at tackle and Doran Post is challenging at center.

At ends for Nebraska will be Le Roy Butherus and Jon McWilliams, Don Kampe, Hawkins, Rhoda or Wheeler at tackles, Taylor and Jim Murphy at guards, and Bob Berguin or Doran Post at the center spot.
