One of the country's leading mathematicians, Prof. Leonard M. Blumenthal of the University of Missouri will deliver a mathematics colloquium lecture at 7:30 p.m. Monday, in Burnett Hall, Room 209.

His topic will be: "New Results in the Distance Geometry of Metric Arca." The lecture is being sponsored by the Mathematics Department and University Research Council.
