The University Intramural Athletic Department has lined up a gala variety of sporting events for the winter season, that is sure to appeal to everyone's interests.

The All University Table Tennis Tournament will kick off the winter program. This will consist of Table Tennis singles on a team basis. Each team will be composed of six members.

Separate flights have been set up for Fraternity, Selleck Hall and Independent entries. The individual winners will play for the All-University Championship.

Entries must be submitted at Room 102 Physical Education Building not later than Friday, November 15. Championship play will begin on Monday, November 18.

The 1956-57 champions are: Sigma Phi Epsilon in the Fraternity Division and Gue 1 in the Selleck Hall Division. Ivar Bergman is the individual champion.

The first week of December has been set aside for the 1957 Intramural Swimming Meet. Entries will be taken at the Swimming Pool entrance between 4:00 p.m. and 4:45 p.m. the days the events are to be held. All entries must be given to Holbe Lepy personally.

The Swimming events will be divided into three days activities. The 50 yard freestyle, 100 yard breast stroke, 200 yard freestyle and 100 yard butterfly will be held on Monday, December 2nd.

Entries in the 100 yard backstroke, 100 yard freestyle and the 75 yard individual medley will swim on Tuesday, December 3, while the diving events will be held on Wednesday, December 4 at 7:00 p.m.

Descending team champion is Phi Delta Theta. Pat Drake is the individual champion.

A schedule of matches will be posted in the Physical Education Building on December 3 in order that football and baseball players may participate before their spring practices begin.

K-State Next Foe Oklahoma

"It's the high point of our season—the chance to play the nation's best football team."

That is Bus Mertes, Kansas State grid coach, talking. "There isn't a squad in the country that wouldn't welcome the opportunity to play Oklahoma," he said. "A lot of them would have an awful slim chance of winning, but the chance is always there. And no one can deny it's always a real thrill to meet the best in the business."

K-State hosts the Sooners here Saturday with kickoff at 1:30 p.m. Gene Keady, leading Wildcat rusher who ranks right behind OU's Cleon Thomas with a 532-yard total (despite missing Saturday's Iowa State game) is not expected to be in the Wildcat lineup against the Sooners. He is nursing a knee injury from the Colorado game of Oct. 19. His 6.7-yard-per-carry average rates as best among Big Eight regulars, leaving K-State minus a potent part of its ground attack.

Stepping into the spotlight last week-end was Ralph Pfeiffer, senior left halfback, who rammed to 83 yards on 18 carries to lead Wildcat-Cyclone rushers. George Whitney, sophomore right halfback replacing Keady, also rated special notice Saturday with 41 yards in 8 tries.

With most other hands healthy the Wildcats should have better squad strength than last Saturday. No further hurts showed from the Cyclone game.

K-State's 14-10 win Saturday pulled her into a three-way tie for fourth in the Big Eight with Kansas and Colorado, and left the Wildcats with a 2-3-1 record overall. Oklahoma's 14-3 victory over Colorado left the Sooners' record unblemished in five games (13 year and 40 games before.
