

Husker Pitching Hits Sooner Hopes

Lefty Hevner and Charlie Ziegenbein, a pair of left-handers who have been in and outers this year for Nebraska, were both decidedly in against Oklahoma Friday and Saturday.

The pair pitched the Huskers over the Sooners, the Big Eight's second place club. The wins dealt a severe blow to the Oklahoma pennant hopes. In the other game, Dwight Siebler, the Husker's right-handed ace, lost a 2-1 heartbreaker.

Fifth Victory
Coach Tony Sharpe nominated Ziegenbein for the ninth game on Friday and

the Wisner senior pitched a six hitter for his fifth victory against two losses. Nebraska also got only six hits, but they bunched four of them in the sixth inning to score five runs. They added two more in the final inning with their last two bingles.

Oklahoma had plenty of chances against Ziegenbein as the lanky junior legion graduate kept himself in hot water throughout the contest. Ziegenbein gave seven walks, hit one man with a pitch and contributed three wild pitches, but stayed on top of the hitters in the clutches.

Two Year Jinx
In the first game Saturday,

Oklahoma extended their two year jinx over Siebler. Siebler was beaten by Oklahoma last year 2-1 though he pitched a no hitter. He had a no hitter going again Saturday for the first five innings, but faulty control betrayed him in the seventh. A single and a pair of walks filled the bases. Siebler then hit Dave Clary to force in one run and Bob Rickey got the winner home with a single.

For Siebler, it was the second loss against six victories. Nebraska had staked him to a run lead in the fifth when Ken Ruisinger doubled and Siebler singled him home.

The win went to Eddie Fischer, who gave up seven hits but didn't issue a walk. It was his fourth win of the campaign.

First Win
Hevner earned his first win in the nightcap with a nifty two hitter. It was the third straight top flight performance by the Fremont flipper. Last week, he allowed two runs in eight innings against Kansas before being lifted for a pinchhitter and the week before was beaten by Oklahoma State, 2-1.

Nebraska gave Hevner the runs he needed in the first when outsinger singled home a pair after Al Karle had

singled and Gil Dunne was hit by a pitch. The Huskers added unearned runs in the second and fourth innings.

Hevner got errorless support from his mates as the Huskers went the entire series without making a miscue. He needed it however, for he doled out nine bases on balls and had the bases loaded on two occasions. The last time, Hevner fanned the last two batters to close out the Oklahoma account.

The two wins dropped Oklahoma to third with a 10-5 record. Nebraska evened the record at 9-9 with three games to go. The Huskers will entertain last place Kansas

State here next weekend in an attempt to boost their conference record permanently above the 500 mark.

Gardner Guns Scarlet To Second In Big Eight

LaFleur Misses Javelin Win With Best Heave
Jet's Performance Merits Schulte Award;

Keith Gardner etched two more marks in the Big Eight record books as he led Nebraska to a second place finish in the Big Eight Track and Field Championships.

Gardner skimed over the 120-yard high hurdles in a 14.0 record timing and ran the fastest 220 in the nation in 20.4, thus breaking the old record set by former Olympian Thane Baker of Kansas State.

Nebraska Second
The Huskers, who hit an all time low two years ago when they finished last, managed to amass 70 points for second place as compared to 145 1-5 for the Kansas Jayhawks, who won their seventh consecutive championship.

Gardner's record breaking performances won him the Henry F. Schulte award presented to the outstanding Big Eight performer in the annual track and field carnival.
Gardner started out the day by running the anchor leg as the Husker 440 foursome of Jahr, Hodson, Young and Gardner surprised favored Oklahoma State on the way to a record setting 41.4 clocking.

Keith came back to erase his 120-yard high hurdle mark by slipping over the barriers in 14.0. He had established a new record on Friday in 14.1.

Gene O'Connor was again Gardner's chief competitor. The Kansas State flash lost to Gardner by inches last year, but this time he was soundly trounced by the fleet Jamaican who whipped him by four yards.

Most Impressive
Gardner's last and most impressive win was in the 220 yard dash when he barely shaded Dee Givens of Oklahoma. Keith's time of 20.4 is the fastest recorded in the nation this year. It also breaks the old conference mark of 20.8. The existing world's record is 20.1.

Bill LaFleur came as close to getting a first place as any other Husker besides Gardner when he threw the javelin 215 feet for second place. This was a career high for LaFleur but was $\frac{1}{2}$ inch short of first place which was taken by John Book of Kansas.

Mike Fleming and Joe Mullins were third and fourth respectively in the 880 as Mike Peake of Colorado wiped out Wes Santee's old record with a 1:50 mark. He was pushed by indoor king Bob Tague of Kansas who was the favorite.

Ken Pollard hit fourteen feet in the pole vault again, but it was only good for third place. Aubrey Dooley, high-flying Oklahoma State vaulter, cleared 14'9" to establish a new conference record. Second place went to Bob Davis of Missouri who hit 14'3 1/2".

Gail Hodgson went after Wes Santee's mile record

lin 215 feet for second place. This was a career high for LaFleur but was $\frac{1}{2}$ inch short of first place which was taken by John Book of Kansas.

Preps Fulfill Record Hopes

Promise and fulfillment were partners this weekend in making the 56th annual State High School Track and Field Championships the best on record.

Class A competitors set five state meet records and two all-time records in leading the field to a showing of record disturbing that even the most critical fans approved. In all, state meet records were altered and two more were tied.

Future Promise

A strong promise of even better meets in the future was indicated by the six juniors and four sophomores who won gold medals in the individual and relay events. A gold medal indicates a meet best regardless of class.

The best showing among the future returnees was turned in by Roger Sayers, Omaha Central's outstanding sophomore. In the 100 yard dash finals on Saturday, Sayers tied the state record set by Scottbluff's Ray Knaub in the Friday prelims. He also won the 220 with a sizzling :21.7, which would have set a new state record had not the wind exceeded the limit. As a final effort he dashed a :28.8 in his 880-rely anchor leg, nearly catching the Scottbluff and Omaha Tech anchor men.

Graduating seniors did not lack an individual hero, however, as Boys Town's Bob Cross won the 440 with a mere .49 after setting a state record in that event Friday with a 48.4.

This latter mark compares favorably with high school singles before failing in the semifinals to Denny Cross of scores in the 440 anywhere in the country and was the outstanding time of the meet. He also fashioned a .48 leg to help the B.T. mile relay team. This final effort made up a great part of the 30-yard deficit which faced him as anchor man in that event.

Relay Record

All of the state meet records that fell on Saturday were in the relay events. In the two mile relay, Lexington wiped out Creighton's 8:24.2 of last year with an 8:21.6. Omaha Central knocked another Creighton Prep record off the books as it roared through the mile relay with 3:25 which was 1.6 seconds lower than Creighton's 3:26.6 mark set two years ago.

Perhaps the best indicator of the strength of this year's field is the fact that none of the 1957 Champions repeated.

Outstanding among the unsuccessful holdover champions was Scottbluff's Ray Knaub, last year's winner in both the 100 and 220, who lost both crowns Saturday after spending the night in Student Health suffering from bronchitis. For consolation he has the gold medal he won as anchor man for Knaut's 880 relay team. Knaut ran the 100 in 9.9, the 220 in 22.0, and his winning anchor leg in 21.2 on Saturday. Friday he set the new state meet record in the 100 of 9.8.

Two of the state meet marks, the Central mile relay mark and Cross's 440 mark, were all-time state records.

In addition marks in the 100, 880, mile, both hurdles, 2-mile relay and the broad jump were season highs.
