In All-University titles, Phi Kappa Psi, Alpha Gamma Rho and Theta Xi are the leaders with three each. Delta Tau Delta, Sigma Phi Epsilon and Phi Delta Theta all have won two All-University crowns. Counting 'A' teams only and not including the Corn-Shucks Basketball Tourney, the Phi Psi and AGRs are the leaders with three, followed by the Theta Xis, Deltas, and Phi Deltas with two. Only three non-fraternity teams have won an All-University title all year. MacLean copped the Rifle title, the Iramians won the Table Tennis tourney and Gus I was victorious in the 'B' Basketball chase. This means that the All-University Intramurals Champ is a cinch to be a Greek squad.

Fraternity Leader

Among Fraternities themselves, Theta Xi is the leader with four. The Phi Psi and AGRs have three, while the Deltas, Sig Eps, Betas and Phi Deltas own two.

Manatt is the leading Selleck winner with three crowns. Runner-ups are Gus II, MacLean, Gus I and Benton, all with two. Heading the Burr list is Kiesselbach, winning three, followed by Smith, double sport titleholder.

No Independent team has been outstanding as six teams have shared the titles. The Iramians stand out with an Independent Volleyball Championship and the All-University Table Tennis title (no Independent Table Tennis Tourney).

The AGRs lead in the number of Ag College championships with four. Second are the Ag Men with two.

Nine sports are remaining before the all-around champ is decided so there is plenty of time for changes in the division front runners.

The Intramural Paddle Ball Tourney enters its final stages this week. In the singles finals Al Arrigunaga, Avery, met Jack Koberg, Delta Upsilon, last night. 2nd Flight champ Arrigunaga, number one netter on Nebraska's tennis team, reached the finals by blasting 1st Flight winner Paul Kotsines, Benton, 21-5, 21-7, and Wayne Hastings, DU, 21-3, 21-1. Koberg downed fellow DU Steve Cass, 21-10, 2-11.

In the Doubles Tourney 1st Flight winners Doug Youngdahl and Myron Papadakis (DU) will meet 2nd Flight champs, DUs Koberg and Dean Frazak. In the opposite bracket, 4th Flighters Bob Hall and Bill Encell (Phi Delta Theta) challenge DUs Bob Kaff and George Garrett, 5th Flight winners.

Ten Batters On Husker Squad Hitting Over The .300 Mark

What has ten batters hitting over .300 and an eight game losing streak? Answer—the Nebraska baseball team.

Through games of last weekend, the Huskers have ten men with batting marks of .300 or better. First baseman Ken Rusinger is leading the regulars with a .414 mark.

Others in the top ten are Tom Redmond (.500), Larry Isaacson (.417), Ely Churchich (.385), Dick Becher (.357), Dick Nelson (.333), Ron Coughill (.333), Don Purcell (.314), Don Vogel (.308) and Harry Tolly (.300).

LeRoy Zentic is just out of the .300 club with a .297 average.

As a team, the Huskers

have collected 141 hits in 499 trips to the plate for a .283 mark. Nebraska has outscored their opponents 108 to 101 while winning seven against eight losses.

Jerry Harris leads the team in runs batted in despite an anemic .231 batting average. Harris has driven 17 teammates across the plate. The Kearney native has 12 hits with two triples and four home runs.

Churchich leads the team in hits with 20 and in total bases with 31. Third baseman Phil Barth is the top home run man with five. He has only ten hits with half of them being homers.

Don Purcell is the leading pitcher with a 3.86 earned run average and a 1-0 won-lost record. Jan Wall is the

top winner with three wins. He has also been charged with three losses.

The Lincoln Northeast graduate has struck out 34 opposing batters in 20 2-3 innings of work. He has walked only 14 and has pitched two of the three complete games racked up by Husker moundsmen. Purcell has the other complete game.

The pitching staff has a combined ERA of 5.07.

Thinclads Place Well In Kansas Relays

The Kansas Relays again had its usual array of stars. The 35th annual Kansas Relays was held Friday and Saturday at Lawrence, Kans.

Former University of Kansas heavyweight Bill Nieder bettered the recognized world record for the shot put with a toss of 63 feet 10 1/4 inches as he continued his conditioning campaign for the Olympic Games.

Nieder said he was confident that he would beat Parry O'Brien, who holds the world recognized shot put record, when they meet next week in the Drake Relays at Des Moines.

The Huskers, who will also participate in the Drake Relays next week, placed second in the distant medley and third in the two-mile relay.

The distance medley team composed of Bob Cross, Dick Kier, Joe Mullins, and Joe American Horse finished second behind Abilene Christian.

Kier, American Horse, Mullins, and Ken Ash finished third in the two-mile relay behind Kansas and Drake.

J. D. Martin, Oklahoma's great pole vaulter, failed in his attempt for a world's record as he settled for 14-11 1/2 in winning the event.

Kansas' tremendous sprinter, Charley Tidwell, won the 100-yard dash in record-equaling time of 9.4. He was however, aided by a 5.5 mile an hour wind so his time can not be counted as a record.

NU Netters Blast Drake for 5th Win

The Nebraska netters won their fifth match of the season against seven losses Monday, trouncing Drake 8-1 on the NU Courts. Today Nebraska meets Washburn University at 1 p.m. at the NU Courts.

The Huskers scored five singles victories and three doubles decisions to defeat Drake. Only Husker loss was a close 8-6, 6-4 defeat of Husker Jack Craft by Bulldog Bob Huber in the number five singles match.

Al Arrigunaga, Bill Kendall, Stan Kruschwitz, Dave Calhoun and John Nasi copped singles wins as the netmen turned in one of their best performances of the season.

Coch Ed Higginbotham was pleased with the Husker victory, commenting, "It was a pleasant afternoon of outstanding tennis."

Higginbotham expressed hopes of two more Husker victories this week. Washburn, today's opponent, is down this year with only one top player, John Wohlfarth. The Huskers downed Thursday's opponent, Omaha, 4-3

in their first meeting of the year. After 12 matches, Kruschwitz, now playing number three, continues to pace the Huskers with a 9-2 record in singles. Arrigunaga (No. 1) is 7-5, Kendall (No. 2) and Calhoun (No. 4) are 4-8, Craft (No. 5) stands 4-6, Nasi (No. 6) is 2-1, and Tom Johnson (No. 7) is 3-0.
