Huskers Travel South

Bushmen To Meet Raiders, Houston

Coach Jerry Bush's cagers open their season tomorrow night at Lubbock, Tex. in a game with Texas Tech before facing strong Houston on Monday night.

The Huskers left this morn-

ing for the southern swing to open with two of the roughest teams in the southwest, which will offer good competition for Nebraska before making its first home appearance, Dec. 8, against the Air Force Academy.

Bush will start Ivan Grupe, 6-5 from Byron, and Charlie Jones, 6-3 southpaw, at the forwards; Bill Vincent, an Omaha product with the big hook, at center; and Daryl Petch, 6-5 from Marysville Kans., and Neil Nannen, a junior from Syracuse.

Grupe is the only senior on the starting quintet.

Texas Tech shouldn't offer as much competition for the Bushmen as Houston, even though the Red Raiders were co-champions of the Southwest Conference last season.

Houston is picked as the top team in the southwest this season by the experts.

Last season the Cougars were 14th in the nation in field goal percentage, 18th in rebounding and 24th in defense and are tabbed as even tougher this season.

Weakness in the backcourt is Houston's only problem. Up front the Cougars will start with 6-4 Don Schverak, 6-5 Tolly Malone and 6-7 Lyle Harger.

Harger was honorable mention All-American and according to his coach will make All-American if he keeps improving.

In the backcourt the Cougars will probably start with Chester Olivier and Reno Lifschultz.

Six home games are on the slate for the cagers with Air Force, Iowa Teachers, Denver University, Miami of Ohio, and a pair of games with Southern California scheduled before the Huskers journey to Kansas City during Christmas vacation for the Big Eight tournament.

Last year the Huskers had a 9-16 record which could have been bettered by a handful of points, Bush points out.

Inexperienced Matmen In Triangular Saturday

Nebraska's young but talented wrestling squad will be facing stiff competition in its first competition Saturday.

The Husker mat team will meet Indiana State, Wisconsin, and Bloomsburg in a triangular at Terre Haute, Indiana.

Bloomsburg is the defending NAIA champion, Indiana State won the Indiana Central Conference title last year and the Badgers are favored to take the Big Ten crown this year.

Against this formidable opposition, Coach Bob Mancuso will use three lettermen: Mike Nissen, 123; Richard VanSickle, 130 and Ken Fox, 177. Nissen, team captain, is the most impressive competitor. He will attempt to keep his perfect three year dual slate clean and improve last year's third place finish in the NCAA tournament.

"We have high hopes for Mike this season. It is hoped he can improve his excellent performance of last year," commented Mancuso.

Nissen, along with the likes of Jim Raschke and Harold Thompson, led last year's ninth place finishers in the NCAA tournament.

Despite the loss of five lettermen, Mancuso expressed confidence in a trio of former Nebraska prep champions that will be in competition Saturday.

Charles Clatterback, Steve Walenz, and Mike Tillotson make up this sophomore group that have worked their way to starting berths in the season's opener.

Mancuso noted that Walenz and Tillotson show good speed and that they should develop rapidly with experience. Clatterback, hampered by a knee operation last year, may prove valuable to the team unless he aggravated his knee.

Mancuso named ten grapplers that will travel to Terre Haute. They are: Walenz, 115; Nissen, 123; Van Sickle, 130; Chuck Martin, 137; Clatterback, 147; Bruce O'Callaghan or Jim Weist, 157; Mike Tillotson, 167; Ken Fox 177; Don McDermott, 191; and Bob Zartner, heavy-weight.
