Nebraska's young but talented wrestling squad will be facing stiff competition in its first competition Saturday.

The Husker mat team will meet Indiana State, Wisconsin, and Bloomsburg in a triangular at Terre Haute,

Bloomsburg is the defending NAIA champion, Indiana State won the Indiana Central Conference title last year and the Badgers are favored to take the Big Ten crown

Against this formidable opposition, Coach Bob Mancuso will use three lettermen: Mike Nissen, 123; Richard Van-Sickle, 130 and Ken Fox, 177. Nissen, team captain, is the most impressive competitor. He will attempt to keep his perfect three year dual slate clean and improve last year's third place finish in the NCAA tournament.
