

YR's To Take No Active Stand

Bill Harding, president of Young Republicans, last night urged the group to become ready now for the primary and the November election in order that there may be a Republican victory.

He said that the organization would be aimed mainly at education until the primary and then would become active in campaigning.

"The club will not take an active stand on any candidate until after the primary," said Harding, "but will urge them to let their platforms be known." He said that candidates for state office would be welcomed as speakers for the group.

New Mexico Regents Attack Discrimination

The board of Regents at the University of New Mexico last week approved a policy aimed at eliminating discriminatory clauses in fraternity and sorority charters at the institution and pledging support to local chapters in the event of conflict with their national organizations.
