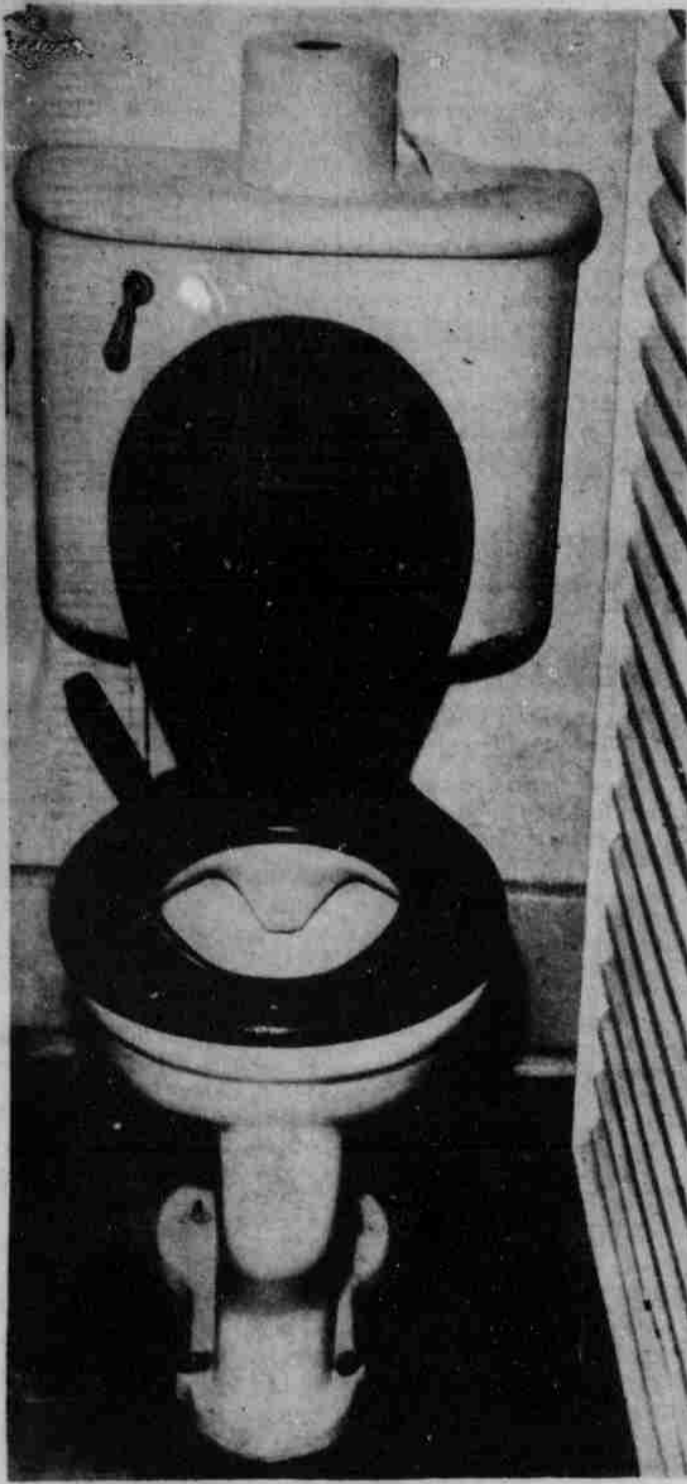


# Stadium Seating Still Big Problem

## Intrasquad Game Gets New Name

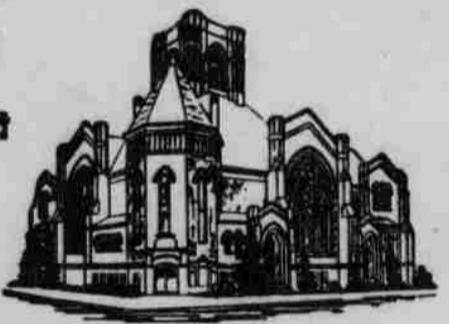
