

### Joel Meier Is New Intramural Director

Joel Meier is the new intramural director for the University of Nebraska, replacing Ed Higginbotham.

Meier is a 1962 University graduate, possesses a bachelor's degree in Physical Education, and a double master's in school administration and physical education.

He has spent the past six months working with the Developmental Office of the Peace Corps in Puerto Rico.

Meier said that Nebraska has one of the best intramural programs in the country; both in numbers of participants and in the number of individual sports offered.

Asked whether he had some new programs to institute, Meier said that he did have

some new ideas that might be implemented but that he would wait until he fully understood the workings of the program before he tried anything new.

Former intramurals director Higginbotham will work closely with Meier this year.

Meier expressed some concern that some of the University students were not fully aware of all of the advantages that the intramural program offers.

"The University pays for an intramural director and for personnel to help him, and the students are missing a good bet by not taking fuller advantage of the programs," he said.

### BIG EIGHT ROUNDUP

## MU's Lane Heads Total Yardage List

Missouri's Gary Lane, defending Big Eight Conference total-offense champion, gained over a quarter of his last season's entire passing and total-offense figure in Saturday's opener against California to dominate individual conference football statistics.

The black and gold Tigers of Mizzou were stunned by a 21-14 beating from Cal last Saturday.

Lane, a junior recorded the best game of his career, hitting on 11 passes for 223 yards and running for 14 more to push his total-offense output to a lofty 237. Last year, he had 710 passing yards and 1,010 total markers. His two touchdown tosses also better his collegiate best.

Only one of the "big three" ground pounders that gave the Big Eight three of the top 11 individuals in rushing nationally last year — Iowa State's Tom Vaughn — was able to maintain his average of the past two years, as he moved to the Conference rushing lead with 81 yards.

Vaughn figured heavily in Iowa State's opening win over perennial rival Drake. The Cyclones downed Drake 25-0.

The champion of the past two years, Gale Sayers of Kansas, found the going tough in his career—48 yards. His lowest output in a single game since 23 yards as a sophomore against Oklahoma. Sayers did move past John Bayuk of Colorado and into eighth place in the Conference's all-time rushing list. His 2,090 mark is 12 behind Colorado's Merwin Hodel.

Kansas experienced some tense moments in defeating Texas TCU 7-3.

Also the victim of a tough defense was Oklahoma's Jim Grisham, who finished second in rushing last year. Grisham pounded for only 40 yards against Maryland. He's had only two small

totals since becoming a starter for the Sooners.

The Sooners managed to salvage a win from Maryland only after a 90-yard scoring pass late in the game. The Sooners won 13-3.

Grabbing the runner-up spot to Vaughn in rushing was Kansas Steve Renko, who picked up 69 yards, mostly on options. Iowa State's exciting sophomore, Tony Baker, got third place with 63.

A third Cyclone, Ken Bunte,

had the best day of his career as he passed (90) and ran (39) for 129 yards to cop runner-up spots in total offense and passing. He had two touchdown throws called back.

Probably the most spectacular play of the weekend—Oklahoma's John Hammond to Lance Rentzel 90-yard scoring pass—gained Hammond third place in passing. This play set a new Oklahoma record and came within four of the Conference mark.

### Kramer Doubtful For Gopher Tilt

The Husker football team heads for its first major test at Minneapolis Saturday with all but two players running in top condition.

Larry Kramer, 229 pound senior left tackle, will make the Minnesota jaunt, but is still hobbled by an ankle injury and is reported as a doubtful performer by coach Bob Devaney. The big tackle also missed the South Dakota opener.

Co-captain Lyle Sittler and sophomore halfback Harry Wilson are reported to be fully recovered from shoulder injuries and ready for action. Kent McCloughan has shaken his thigh injury and is running at top speed.
