Although the Missouri-Nebraska football game is called a "regional" broadcast by ABC-TV, the game will be aired in 34 states, including all of Nebraska.

Since the first of the year, when the contracts were signed with ABC-TV, the NCAA and the Nebraska Board of Regents, preparations have been made for the game. But this week, the action moved into high gear, with the ABC technicians and production personnel in Lincoln laying the groundwork and the rest of the television people in town today to finish the work.

There will be seven cameras televising the game with the pick-up station in Hollywood. One of the cameras will be atop a 150 foot crane located in the south end of the

The game will be televised in full "living" color and both teams have promised to add "live" action. And with respect to both teams, I doubt if the action could be anything but live.

Announcers for the game will be Chris Schenkel, Bill Fleming and Bud Wilkinson.

Preparation for a televised football game includes more than just setting up the equipment. All of the music (to be played at half-time by the two bands) had to be cleared through the various publishing houses before permission was given to play.

This summer a team of technicians inspected Memorial Stadium to insure that Nebraska's facilities were

adequate. They were. A film-clip on the University of Nebraska covering the academic and cultural side of the school had to be supplied for the pre-game show. And last week an ABC photographer was in Lincoln to shoot Larry Wachholtz, on film that is. A special show on "The Little Man in College Football" will also be featured on the network pregame show.

All of this (and much more behind the scenes) precedes a college football game to be televised. Keep in mind that ABC broadcasts four games a week and you'll probably wonder, like I do, how a game ever makes it into your living room.

## Stith Leads Huskers In Unaided Tackles

Could you imagine 6-5, 261-pound University of Nebraska tackle Carel Stith as an interior decorator?

His interior work is actually on the inside of the Husker line and his decoration comes on the statistics sheets of the leading NU linemen.

The hulking Husker, who hopes to play pro ball after graduation, leads Nebraska in unassisted tackles and is now third in the assisted category.

Stith has 32 unaided takedowns to his credit and ranks behind All-American candidate Wayne Meylan and Lynn Senkbeil with 25 assisted ones.

Carel's rush on defense has also netted NU two recovered fumbles, a blocked punt and a blocked pass so far this year. Stith, a 1963 graduate of Lincoln Southeast High,

# Will Go Coast-To-Coast

Two top Big Eight teams and two of the nations' most successful coaches will encamp in Nebraska's Memorial Stadium Satur-day in what has to be called the big conference game of the week.

The Missouri Tigers, 2-0-1 in conference competion,

will be here to try to put a blemish on Nebraska's undefeated string of six games before an expected record crowd of 65,000 and a coastto-coast ABC television audience.

Kick-off time has been moved up to 12:15 p.m. to facilitate broadcasting of the game.

Husker coach Bob Devaney currently leads the nation with a winning percentage of .831, based on a lifetime record of 79-16-5. That means Devaney will be gunning for his 80th win Saturday, Missouri's Dan Devine ranks third nationaly with a 88-25-8 record. His only loss this season was a 15-24 setback against UCLA.

Will Devaney and the Huskers try anything new against Devine and Company? "We're not going to come up with anything dif-ferent," stated the Husker coach Thursday.

He said the only new kink in the Husker offense against Colorado, following a much publicized secret practice session prior to the game with the Buffaloes, was to set the fullback in motion from Nebraska's spread formation.

Devaney called the yearly tangle with the Tigers, one of our most intense rivalries. Missouri's a tough competeter each year." He pointed out that the difference between the Huskers and Missouri in the four years he's been at Nebraska is three points in Ne-

braska's favor. Devaney said he

the Tigers to be similar to Colorado; a tough defense and more prone to the running game offensively.

The Tigers are second to Nebraska in Big Eight total defense, limiting six foes to 252 yards a game compared to the Huskers' 238.5. Offensively, Missouri is fourth in rushing offense with a 157.7 yard average.

Devaney reported that in-jured right end Dennis Richnafsky and left halfback Ron Kirkland would not be ready for Missouri. He said he didn't know for sure how long they would continue to be out of action.
