That November week, however, will still be a full one. Uriah Heep and Savoy Brown will be at Pershing on Monday, Nov. 6, and Wayne Cochran and his C.C. Riders will be at the Royal Grove the following night.

More cancellation news. The International Circus and Ice Show which was to have been at Pershing this weekend has canceled its performances. The show's star, Karl Wallenda, injured himself in a fall a couple of weeks ago and hasn't recovered sufficiently for the show to go on.

That means circus fans will have to make the trip to Omaha to see the Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus. "The Greatest Show on Earth" opens Wednesday at the Omaha Civic Auditorium. There will be 10 performances during the show's stay—through next Sunday.
