

Group advises women in agriculture

The Advisory Council For Women Student Concerns is making women aware of the career opportunities in agriculture. T.E. Hartung, dean of the college of agriculture, said the council is a key advisory group because it helps women with career advising and other special programs.

Hartung said the council was formed several years ago because a higher percentage of women students were enrolled in agriculture-related fields.

Although Hartung said he is disappointed in the council's visibility on campus, future events will try to improve the group's visibility.

Council Chairwoman Susan Borgelt, a junior animal science major, said

awareness outside of campus also is important.

"More women need to become aware of this committee," Borgelt said. "There are many careers opening up in agricultural sales and business that women just don't know about."

Borgelt said she thinks women are somewhat intimidated by the male-dominated agriculture business.

Borgelt said she often has noticed the male dominance in agriculture. A member of the UNL livestock and judging team, Borgelt is the only female

"If you excel or even do a little better than another man, he will usually accept you," she said.

Hartung said women's possibilities for advancement in agriculture are high.

"Women do have to work harder at placement than men," he said, "but only because the majority of men have a stronger background in agriculture."

Borgelt said the council's success will be determined by input from other people. She said the committee now consists of Hartung, ag advisory board member, Kelly Downing, assistant professor of animal science, Mary Beck and undergraduates Ruth Witte, Deb Schuitz and Monica Dolezal.

Because the council has no immediate funds, guest speakers and lecturers are volunteers, Borgelt said.

Hartung said some money is provided by the college of agriculture on a "boot-strap" basis.

"We accommodate them when they need money

for resources," Hartung said.

Borgelt said an AgForum will be March 6 in the East Union. The forum, "Women in Agriculture: A Step Ahead," will feature speakers such as a veterinarian, a county extension agent and possibly someone from agri-business and a rancher or farmer.

The forum will be a brown-bag luncheon and will follow panel-discussion format.
