"It's both a physical and mental challenge," he said. "It's something students don't get in class."

The trips also break up regular routines and offer participants an opportunity to meet new people, he said.

On the average, 12 people go on each trip, Ebel said, so the trips are informal and intimate. After trips, he said, the groups often get together for a slide show of a trip.
