Gallery offers access to Lincoln art

The Eleventh Street Gallery is an ongoing, undefinable commodity, but it's aims can be summarized in three words; access, community, and chal-

The Eleventh Street Gallery, 305 S. 11th St., opened only six months ago but in that time span has housed nine exhibits. The shows have (with one exception) displayed the work of Lincoln artists, 34 all told. The

Antiquarian Bookstore and artists co-operatives in Omaha's Old Market district. It's an opportunity sorely needed by Lincoln, but also one that can only continue through community support.

shows when listed chronologically are a testament to both the gallery's and Lincoln's artistic potentials. They have generally shown a proclivity for the more adventurous/controversial pursuits of the visual arts. Recently, the gallery featured the work of Dear Madame's a feminist discussion group, dealing with the issue of violence against women. The only non-Lincoln show the gallery has displayed was a poster show of political Latin American art, presented by LASCO, the Latin American Solidarity Committee.

The Eleventh Street is clearly aiming to be one of those alternatives to conventional marketing strategies, something like an Open Harvest for the eyes. It's idealistic aims in this area is paralleled only by the

"We need volunteers," says Peter Tooth, one of the gallery's three founders. "Monetary donations are always nice, but if some people, especially students, would give up a bit of their spare time, we could keep the bloody place open more hours."

Tooth is from Britain. The other founders are Lincolnites Sharon Lewandowsky and Ed Rumbaugh. Recently, Albbuguerque native Elane Perea has contributed emotional and financial support.

The Eleventh Street is a community-access gallery and operates a slide file and artist reference area artists. Like everything else at the gallery, it's free and available.
