The total system combines seven interactive components. A video monitor/receiver; VHS Hi-Fi stereo VCR; 50 watt integrated amplifier; AM/FM tuner; audio cassette deck; linear tracking turntable; compact digital audio disc player; and twin stereo speakers. The system is controlled by a microchip computer inside the monitor receiver and is commanded by a 52-key wireless remote control device.

The integrated system allows you to perform multiple functions simultaneously. A true entertainment buff could record a broadcast channel on the VCR while recording an album on the stereo cassette deck, and — at the same time — watch a completely different broadcast channel.

Dohmen said the buyers market for the \$5,000 dollar system will basically denote into three groups.

"Our RCA market survey identified three potential buying groups," he said. "First you have the early adapter. This would be anyone who is audio or videophile.

"Then you have the group that wants the best at any price. And, finally, the family entertainment group."

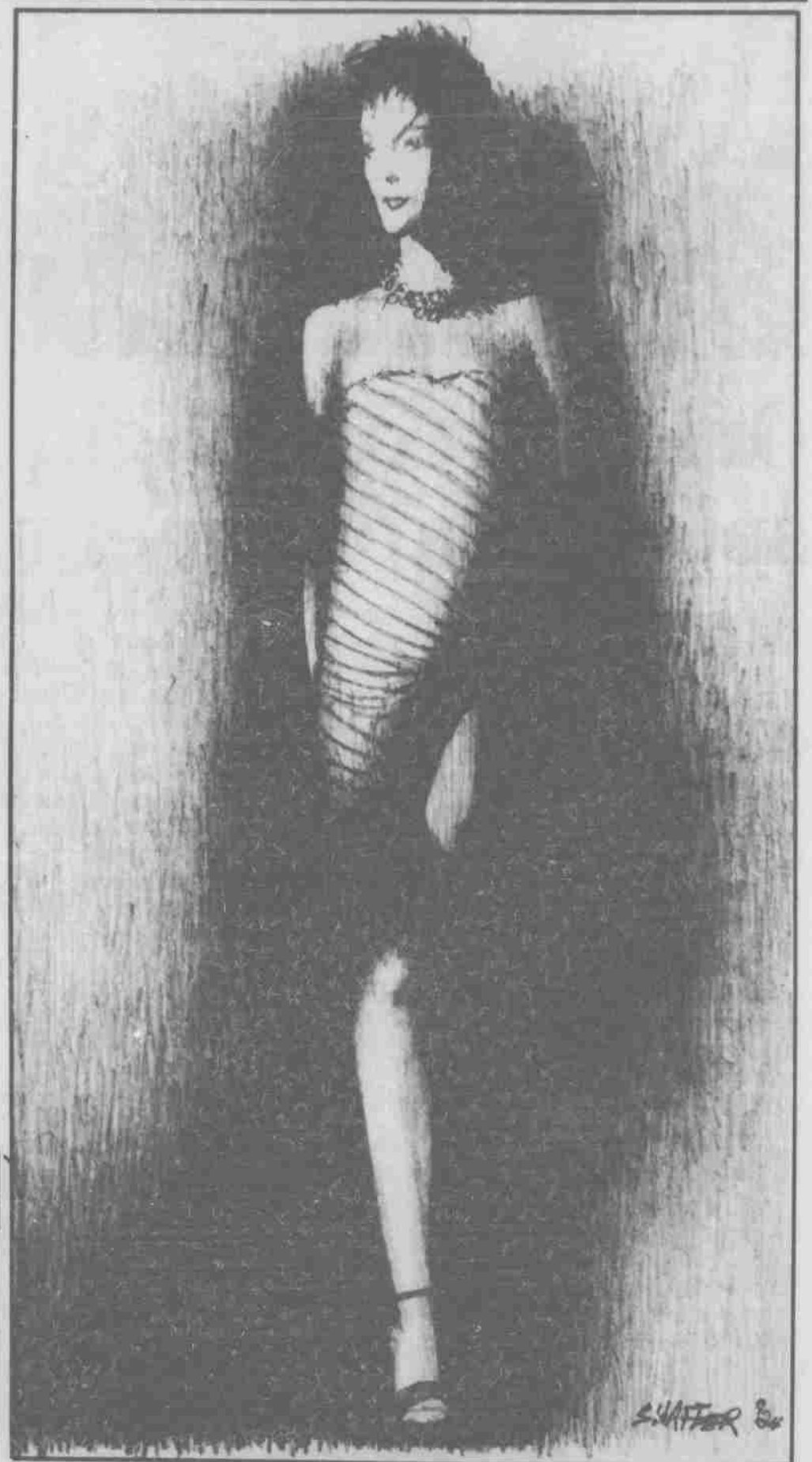
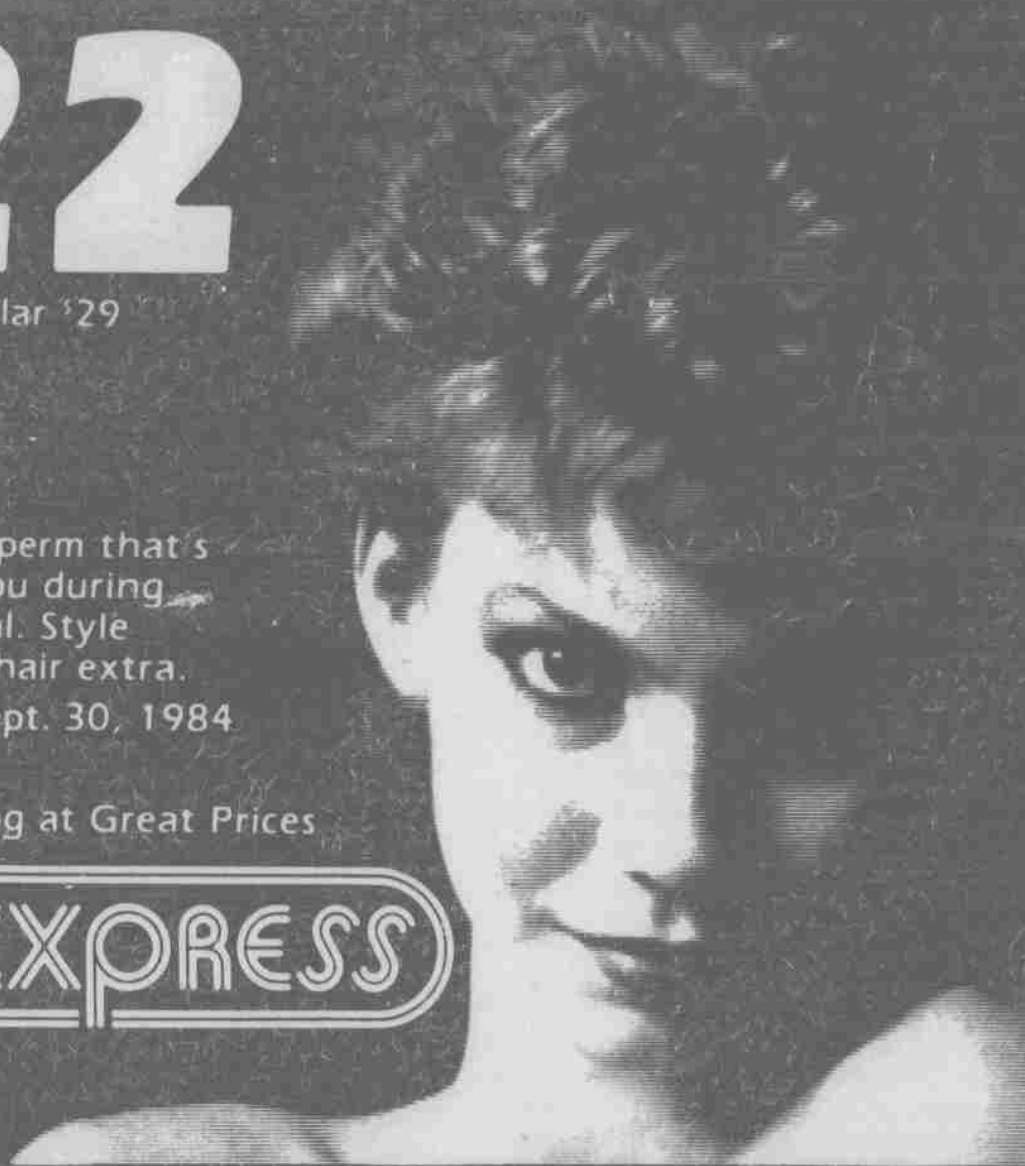
