

Area bowlers to start tournament ball rolling

National tournament winners in any sport have to start somewhere. For UNL and Lincoln area bowlers, the somewhere is the Nebraska Union lanes tonight, site of the first qualifying round of the Miller Doubles Championships.

Any combination of bowlers may compete in the tournament, which will send its winners to the state tournament in January. Winners from that tournament will go to the national finals in Reno, Nev., where a grand prize of \$10,000 will be awarded.

Last year, 63 doubles groups won cash prizes at the state tournament for a total payout of \$7,087.60.

Dave Dudek, night manager of the Nebraska Union RecRoom, said today's 8 p.m. competition will be the first of three tournament rounds the union lanes will sponsor. Other qualifying nights will be Nov. 26 and Dec. 3.

Dudek said the doubles tandems should have an established sanctioned league average before the tournament.

"You can enter without a sanctioned average," Dudek said. "But it's awfully tough to win that way."

A handicap system based on a 210 score will be used at each stage of the tournament. Bowlers will get handicaps as determined by the difference between their average and 210.

The tournament is set up so one of every six teams will get to the state tournament, Dudek said. A \$10 entry fee for each team is required.

Malaysian students dominate mini-Olympics

It didn't take four years for the rest of the world to get back on America for its domination at the 1984 Olympics. Saturday and Sunday, Malaysia, Indonesia and the Chinese students finished well ahead of the United States in the mini-Olympics sponsored by the International Student Athletic Committee.

Syed Feizal, one of the students who organized the committee as well as the Olympics, said that overall, the event ran smoothly. More than 100 students participated in the six-sport Olympics, raising \$1 each for the committee.

"Overall, we did fine," Feizal, a native of Seremban, Malaysia, said. "Next year, we would like to have more American participation."

Malaysian students only won titles in table tennis doubles and women's individual bowling, but finished with 29 total points. The team of Chinese students was second with 16½ points. Feizal said there were some surprises in the individual competition, particularly in the eight-ball billiards. Genny Keeler, who represented Nebraska and the region in the national collegiate unions tournament last spring, lost in head to head competition with Arab students.

"They usually don't enter the union tournaments, but we all found out they play very good pool," Feizal said.

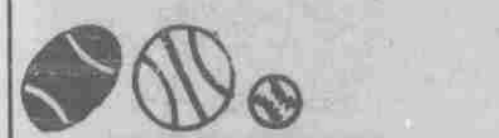

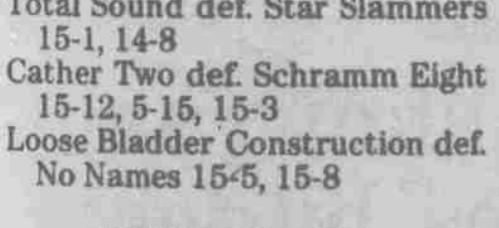
