Other departments have been strengthened in proportion. The catalogue is remarkably concise and business like in make-up and presents a large amount of information in a conveniently condensed form. The typographical appearance contrasts sharply with that of last year's catalogue, and shows that what is cheapest is not always best. We have wondered why cuts of the university buildings have not been printed in our catalogues. We have five good buildings and should show them to those who contemplate attending the university. It is customary among colleges to give cuts of the college buildings, and while THE HESPERIAN does not wish to advocate anything merely because others do it, we think that this is a matter in which we might well imitate other institutions. The U. of N. is so far ahead of the other colleges in the state in the matter of buildings that we might well advertise the institution a little by making this superiority known.
