There was a renewed depression of stock exchange this morning, with a further sharp decline in prices in some of the leading shares. Milwaukee & St. Paul was decidedly weaker, and generally paid for sale under which it dropped from 1 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 1 10 $\frac{1}{2}$. There was considerable excitement for a time, and the break in this stock had an unfavorable influence on the balance of the list, which also declined sharply; Denver & Rio Grande declined 4 per cent.; Alton & Terre Haute, 2 per cent.; Milwaukee & St. Paul, 1 10 $\frac{1}{2}$; Illinois Central declined 24 per cent.; St. Paul & Omaha 1 per cent.; Nashville & Chattanooga and C. & B. & Q., 3 per cent. The trunk lines were weaker in some cases, but, as a rule, did not share to any great extent in the depression. Towards noon a slight rally set in and there was a sharp recovery from the low point during the afternoon, under purchases to long short contracts; prices showed a decline of 3 to 4 per cent., the latter in Milwaukee & St. Paul. Trunk line shares declined to 12 per cent. for the day, the latter in Lake Shore; Chicago, Burlington & Quincy declined 5 per cent., and the Rock Island 1 per cent.
