FINANCE AND COMMERCE.

NEW YORK, December 15.—Money—Easy at 1 1/4 per cent; closed offered at 1 per cent.

Prime paper—4 1/2.

Stamping Bills—Weak at 4 1/2; demand 4 1/4.

Governments—4 percent lower for 4's and 5's lower for 3's.

Railways—Higher for Erie consolidated seconds.

Stocks—Before the first call became weak and depressed for the whole list and later on declined 1/4 to 3/4 per cent. Lackawanna, Chicago, Burlington & Quincy, Rock Island and New York Central led the downward movement. Grangers were affected by reports adverse to legislation and Rock Island declined on a rumored reduction in the dividend rate. This was later officially denied. In the afternoon the market was firmer in covering short contracts, but in the last half hour North-western weakened to 601 and the other active shares dropped 1/4 to 3/4 in sympathy. The feature of trading was option sales. New York Central sold 100 shares at 84 1/2, dividend on, and 85 1/2, ex-dividend. Four thousand three hundred shares thus changed hands. Compared with Saturday closing prices are 1/4 to 1/2 lower, except Canada Southern, Central Pacific, Erie, Northern Pacific, Pacific Mail, Reading and Texas Pacific, which are 1/4 to 1/2 higher.
