THE DAY AT WASHINGTON.

WASHINGTON, June 4.—Naval officers who were on the recent expedition say the people of Panama are anxious that the United States should make its temporary possession of Panama permanent.

The commission of pensions has stricken off the list of pensions the names of about two hundred pensioners who were found to be not entitled to pensions either because they had recovered from their disabilities or were not dependent upon the government.

The Colombian minister says the presence in New York of Senor Helguin is not for the purpose of ascertaining the sentiments of the United States concerning the revolutionaries, but for making Panama a neutral state.

ST. LOUIS, Mo., June 4.—A special from Columbia, Mo., says that Secretary Bayard, accompanied by a carload of lesser democratic lights from St. Louis, to participate in the commencement exercises of the state university, arrived to-day.
