"SHOOTING" THE PROFESSION

An Omaha Photographer Tells About Actors in the Studio.

CAMERA. BEFORE THE HOURS

Adepts in the Art of Posing Who Know What They Want and Know Also How to

Obtain It.

"I enjoy photographing stage people," said Mr. Heyn, the Fifteenth street photographer, 'principally because there is so little annoy. nce and trouble about it.

"From study, experience and knowing how

o put themselves in the best position for a fine picture, actors are easier subjects than I have found in any other class. 'However, my experience with them has not been extensive enough to tell you much that would be interesting or entertaining

Very few of the artists that visit Omaha have time to get their pictures taken. Not more than one or two companies ever remained longer than three days, consequently I don't to do much of that kind of work.

"No, I have never 'shot at' any of the famous stars. They are bought up by Falk, Sarony and Mora in New York and bind themselves not to sit for other photographers.

"When Langtry first came to this country and was the craze Sarony paid her \$2,500 on onsideration that she should not enter another gallery in this country.

That is because they know how to elevate or lower their eyes, how to fix the mouth and the hair, how to adjust a hat or a feather to produce the best effect—in short, how to sit for a good picture.
"My efforts with those whom I named
